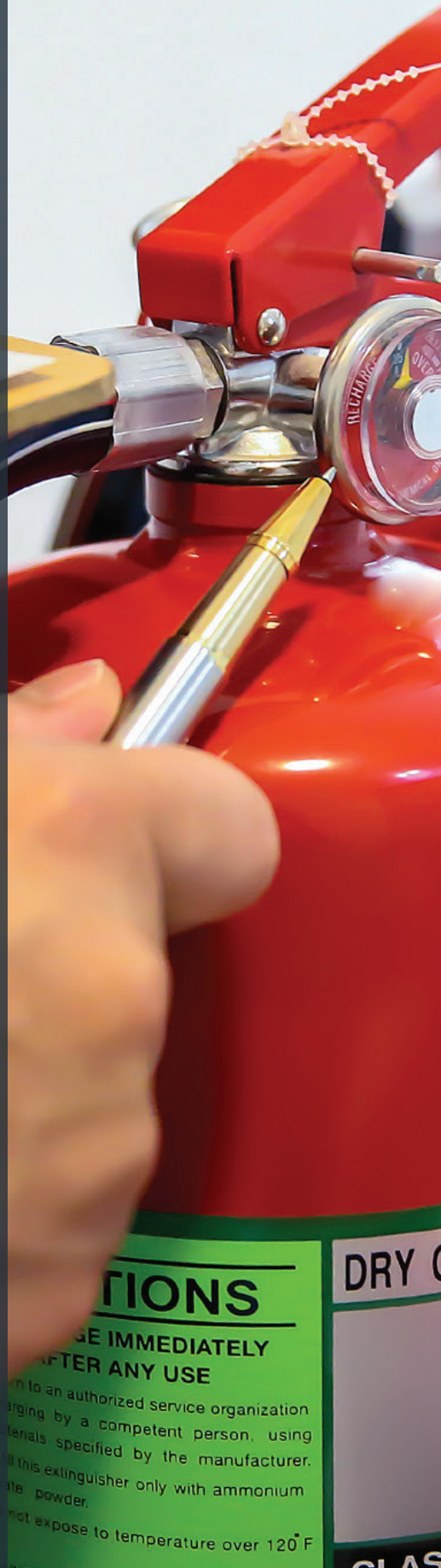

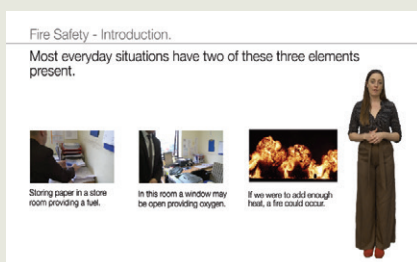
What does the basic fire safety course cover?

The basic fire safety course explores:

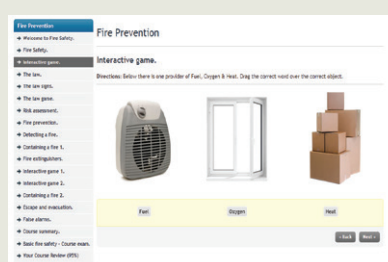
- The legal aspects of fire safety regulations.
